#### ■ DIRECTOR'S NOTES

A work colleague recently asked me what I loved most about directing live theatre. My response was, "because it is fleeting; it is unable to be duplicated. Theatre is not like the movies, where you are able to relive a moment over and over by rewinding, because film is recorded— stuck in time. The theatre, and the world we create for you in performance will, after only a few hours, exist only in your memory." When I finished explaining these reasons to my colleague, I realized that I was explaining a metaphor for life. Our memories are tricky. They can be stuck in our mind forever, pushed out, or forgotten entirely. Our brains manipulate memories to most benefit our selves. We have the ability to alter our memories about those we love, those we don't, those who left us, and those we are scared of. Memories vary from person to person what did they actually say or do? Was it that? No, actually, it was this. Inflection. Intention. Subtext. Mood. All of this plays into memory.

The Glass Menagerie is a memory play. What we may or may not remember about any particular moment may look peculiar or strange, which is why you will notice a fragmented artistic design on stage. Specifically, this is Tom's memory; we have decidedly incorporated and (or) omitted elements solely based on Tom's perspective. It is fascinating to think about what Tom recalls, why, and how, because it informs every decision we've made. You may remember in school reading Amanda Wingfield as a monster, or amplifying Laura's physical defect in your mind. We aim to challenge these conventions. The Glass Menagerie is not a play that wraps itself up in a nice, tidy bow. This is no secret, however, we are hoping to bring a fresh energy to this near-perfect American classic. Among other things, this play is funny, jocular, and tender. Perhaps different from what you remember?

After our final performance, the company will perform a ritual called "strike." Striking the stage means tearing apart the set, storing properties, costumes, and furniture for future productions. In a short time, the stage in front of you will be stripped away, empty. These objects lose their significance as they relate to this story—the picture frame and the victrola will be nothing more than items in a storage closet. The actors go home; the Wingfield family will vanish. After striking, there will only be a memory of The Glass Menagerie. But what we create within this space gives meaning to mere words on a page, and it lives on within us. Even if these moments are fleeting, my hope is that we are able to solidify this beautiful story to your memory. Enjoy.



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

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
