DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Welcome to Paris in the late 1880s!

Initially, I was supposed to direct a much different show from the one you will experience—one that takes place in 1st-century Judaea. However, performance rights to smaller theatres like ours can be revoked if that show is on tour or if the play will be revived on Broadway. That is what happened here—but everything happens for a reason.

I have truly loved working on *Sunday in the Park with George*. It is a musical that is not often produced, partly due to the difficulty of Sondheim's score. This cast and crew have been amazing to work with and create alongside. I am grateful for them and proud to have been able to spend time creating this world.

Life is made up of tiny moments that create a whole picture. I fell in love with George Seurat's painting, *A Sunday Afternoon on the Island of La Grande Jatte*, the first time I saw it at the Art Institute of Chicago. Growing up in northern Illinois, I was fortunate enough to go on field trips to the institute several times through grade school and high school. To stand in front of that art and be drawn into the world Seurat created is overwhelming.

For this production, I tried to pay homage to the artist and his masterpiece wherever and whenever possible—and I hope you enjoy the production.

Special thanks to the cast, Keith Eisenstadt and Daniel Gentry, for helping me take what was in my head and putting it on stage. Andi and Michelle, thank you for working through some of the most challenging music Sondheim has ever written. To Adrienne, Lily, and Emma, thank you for putting up with my schedule and obsession.

Anthologies of his work include Side by Side by Sondheim, Marry Me a di, the Center and this amazing cast Little, You're Gonna Love Tomorrow, Putting it Together and Sondheim on Sondheim. He composed the scores of the films Stavisky and Reds and songs for *Dick Tracy* and the television production *Evening Primrose*. His collected lyrics with attendant essays have been published in two volumes: Finishing the Hat and Look, I Made A Hat. In 2010 Broadway's Henry Miller's Theatre was renamed The Stephen Sondheim Theatre in his honour; in 2019, London's Queens Theatre was also renamed the Sondheim.

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
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
