A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

At its core, *Steel Magnolias* is a story about belonging, resilience, and the power of community. Truvy's salon isn't just a beauty shop—it's a sanctuary. It's where these women come to be themselves, to laugh, cry, and lift each other up. It's a space where they can exist free from the pressures of the outside world, a world that often asks them to be smaller, quieter, or less complicated than they truly are.

Many of us find *Steel Magnolias* to be the perfect escape: funny and warm, nostalgic from the hit 1989 film. But what these characters are dealing with, the contrast between the world inside Truvy's salon and the world outside it, is serious business. The salon is warm and built on love, while the world beyond is often harsh, unpredictable, and marked by traditional expectations of masculinity and femininity. Shelby, in particular, straddles both worlds. She embraces the traditions of womanhood—marriage, motherhood, and beauty—but also defies expectations by making choices that others see as reckless or defiant. Her story reminds us that strength comes in many forms. Sometimes it's loud and bold, sometimes it's quiet tenacity and unwavering. But it's always about standing in your truth, even when the world pushes back.

Growing up, it was strong, supportive women—women much like the ones in this play—who helped shape me and gave me a place to be my true self. Just as Truvy's salon provides a refuge for these women, queer people have long built communities in places where they can find understanding, love, and a sense of belonging. Whether in salons, theaters, bars, or chosen families, these spaces are vital. That's why *Steel Magnolias* still matters in 2025. It's a reminder that the relationships we <u>all</u> build in these spaces are life-giving and life-saving.

What has made this production truly special is not just the story we're telling, but the way this cast and crew have embodied its themes. From the start, there have been challenges—scheduling conflicts and unexpected hurdles; moments where it felt like the odds were against us. But just like the women in this play, this team showed up for each other. They persevered, supported one another, and never lost sight of why this story is worth telling. It has been an honor to watch them bring these characters to life, not just with talent, but with heart. Creatively, this production is as much theirs as it is mine, and I am lucky to have each of them.

In the end, *Steel Magnolias* is about showing up for the people we love. It's about finding strength in each other and in the spaces we call home. That's what this cast and crew have done, and I couldn't be more proud. This show belongs to them, to you, and to everyone who understands the power of love, friendship, and resilience. I dedicate this production to my mother, CeCe—my biggest fan and the steeliest magnolia I know. Without her and for many reasons, none of us would be here tonight, in this moment, experiencing this together.

Thank you for being here. Thank you for being part of this community. We're so glad to share this story with you. It's all for you.

STEEL MAGNOLIAS continues to thrive in theatrical productions throughout the world. Immediately bridging a career from stage to screen, Harling adapted his original play into the popular film of the same title, which starred Sally Field, Julia Roberts, Shirley MacLaine, Olympia Dukakis, Dolly Parton, and Daryl Hannah. Over the years, Mr. Harling has become a much sought-after screenwriter: other credits, to name a few, include "Soapdish," which was based on Harling's acting experience and starred Sally Field, Whoopi Goldberg, and Robert Downey Jr., and "FIRST WIVES CLUB" for Paramount, starring Bette Midler, Goldie Hawn, and Diane Keaton.

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
